Name Changes and QDROs

Name Change - The Legal Process:

Name Change at the time of Divorce

O.C.G.A. § 19-5-16 - Restoration of maiden or prior name

In all divorce actions, a party may pray in his pleadings for the restoration of a maiden or prior name. If a divorce is granted, the judgment or decree shall specify and restore to the party the name so prayed for in the pleadings.

Name Change after Divorce

O.C.G.A. § 19-12-1 - Petition for name change; notice of filing; consent of minor's parents or guardian; service on parents or guardian; time of hearing; judgment; clerk's fees.

Name Change - The Actual Process:

Driver's License:

https://dds.georgia.gov/updatechange-license-information

Applicant name changes must be processed, in person, at a Customer Service Center. Applicants are required to update the name listed on their driver's license/permit/ID card within 60 days, as required by law.

For current GA Customers - If the applicant's name has changed from original birth record or passport, the applicant is required to present certified legal documents supporting each name change such as marriage certificate, divorce decree, adoption papers and/or legal name change. NOTE: All name change documents are required for new and new to GA customers.

All documents must be in English.

Applicants married in the state of Georgia, on or after November 1, 1982, and who wish to hyphenate a surname and married name must present a certified copy of the marriage license application reflecting the selection of a hyphenated surname.

Applicants whose surnames have changed by reason of marriage, that occurred outside the state of Georgia, may obtain a driver's license/permit/ID card in the hyphenated married surname upon submission of a certified copy of a marriage license application or state-issued marriage certificate for the marriage.

If presenting a divorce decree, it must contain a name-change order which will serve as legal proof of your intended name change.

If you are requesting the change <u>less than one year after your passport was issued</u>, submit via mail:

- Form DS-5504 (attached);
- Your most recent U.S. passport;
- Your original or certified name change document, such as a marriage certificate, divorce decree, or court order; and
- One color passport photo.

If you are requesting the change <u>more than one year after your passport was issued</u>, you may be eligible to renew your passport by mail using Form DS-82. If you are eligible to use Form DS-82*, please submit the following by mail:

- Form DS-82 (attached);
- Your most recent U.S. passport;
- Your original or certified name change document, such as a marriage certificate, divorce decree, or court order;
- One color passport photo;
- Adult Renewal Applicant fees or Child Applicant fees, depending on your age;

- Please note: you must send Form DS-82 and supporting documents using USPS. UPS, FedEx, DHL, and other companies cannot deliver to the PO Box addresses listed on Form DS-82.

If you are requesting the change more than one year after your passport was issued, and you are not eligible to renew your passport by mail using Form DS-82, you should apply in-person. Please submit the following:

- Form DS-11 (attached)
- Your evidence of U.S. citizenship and photocopy of that evidence;
- Your original or certified name change document, such as a marriage certificate, divorce decree, or court order (no photocopies or notarized copies);
- Valid ID and photocopy of that ID;
- One color passport photo; and
- Adult First-Time Applicant fees or Child Applicant fees, depending on your age.

If you legally change your name because of marriage, divorce, court order or any other reason, you must tell Social Security so you can get a corrected card. You cannot apply for a card online. There is no charge for a Social Security card. This service is free.

The same applies once you receive the I-766 card, Employment Authorization Document (EAD), from the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) and bring required evidence. See Defining the legal Name for an SSN.

To get a corrected Social Security card, you will need to:

Qualified Domestic Relations Orders (QDROs)

What are the various retirement/savings plans that may potentially be subject to division:

- 401(a) plans are generally offered by government and nonprofit employers; participation in a 401(a) plan is often mandatory; Employee contributions to 401(a) plan are determined by the employer (more like an old school "pension")
- 401(k) plans are more common in the private sector; participation in a 401(k) plan is not mandatory; while 401(k) participants decide how much, if anything, they wish to contribute to their plan.
- 403(b) plans are a retirement plan typically reserved for employees of public schools and 501(c)(3) organizations. Examples of the types of organizations that may offer a 403(b): Public schools, Cooperative hospital organizations, 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organizations, Religious institutions.
- 457 plans are available to employees of state/local governmental agencies and certain tax-exempt organizations.

Is the retirement benefit subject to QDRO?

Employee Retirement Income Security Act ("ERISA") 29 U.S.C. 1056 – generally unassignable, but a Qualified Domestic Relations Order is exempt from ERISA's anti-assignment provision, 29 USC 1056(d)(3)(A).

- City, county, state pensions, not divisible via QDRO.

(Note, just because a retirement benefit cannot be divided via QDRO does not mean that it is not subject to division via the equitable division powers of the Superior Court)

QDRO language for Settlement Agreement/Final Order

- (i) Husband currently participates in a 401(k) plan provided through his employer, _. Approximately _ of the current balance of Husband's 401(k) plan is attributable to his premarital contributions and _ of the account's current balance is attributable to marital contributions. The parties agree that Wife shall receive a sum equal to Fifty percent (50%) of the marital retirement funds. Wife shall receive, by means of a Qualified Domestic Relations Order ("QDRO"), _ percent (_%) of the gross value as of the date of distribution/other specific date. Husband and Wife represents and warrants that he neither has not made any withdrawal, loan or other investment division since __, which would decrease the value of the his or her account, and he neither shall not do so until such time as Wife's 401(k) interest is completely distributed to her. Wife shall be entitled to receive her 401(k) interest without regard to the death of Husband. Wife shall be entitled to receive her benefit in any form and at any time permitted under the terms of the Plan.
- (ii) Wife or her attorney shall be responsible for the preparation of any necessary QDRO incorporating the terms of this paragraph. Said QDRO shall be subject to the reasonable approval of Husband and the Court of proper jurisdiction in this case, as well as the administrator(s) of the 401(k) plan.
- (iii) The Court shall retain jurisdiction over the provisions of this paragraph, and the QDRO, in order to implement same, and any amendments thereto necessary to effectuate the intent of this paragraph. The Parties shall cooperate and timely provide and/or sign any document or information needed to facilitate the drafting or implementation of the QDRO.

Contempt actions

Venue:

It has clearly been the rule in Georgia as in other states that contempt applications must be filed in the county where the divorce and alimony decree was entered. <u>Buckholts v. Buckholts</u>, 251 Ga. 58 (read the case to see alternate applications to this rule).

Counterclaim for Contempt:

The contempt remedy is part of the judiciary's inherent power to enforce its orders. As such, an action for contempt is ancillary to the primary action and is characterized as a motion and not a pleading. Because a contempt action is not a new civil action, many provisions of the Civil Practice Act do not apply, and the Supreme Court of Georgia has consistently held that a party may not file a counterclaim in response to an application for contempt. Mullins-Leholm v. Evans, 322 Ga. App. 869.

Civil vs. Criminal Contempt:

Georgia law recognizes a distinction between "civil" or "criminal" contempt, although acts of contempt are neither civil nor criminal. Once an act has been determined to constitute contempt of court, the action the court takes to deal with the contempt determines whether the contempt is deemed "criminal" contempt or "civil" contempt, a distinction historically made by both appellate courts in this state. The distinction between the two is that criminal contempt imposes unconditional punishment for prior acts of contumacy, whereas civil contempt imposes conditional punishment as a means of coercing future compliance with a prior court order. Carlson v. Carlson, 324 Ga. App. 214.

Contempt Powers of Superior Court Judge:

Under O.C.G.A. § 15-6-8, a superior court's authority to punish for criminal contempt is limited to the imposition of fines not exceeding \$1,000 and imprisonment not exceeding 20 days, or both, and the U.S. Supreme Court has determined that no constitutional right to a jury trial exists in cases of contempt imposing punishment of under six months. Moreover, Georgia law provides a statutory right to a jury trial in contempt proceedings only for persons who are subject to imprisonment for failing or refusing to pay over money under any court order, decree or judgment where the person denies that he has power, custody or control of such money. O.C.G.A. § 15-1-4(b). Carlson.

Incarceration for failure to pay child support: the <u>Floyd</u> Order: <u>Floyd v. Floyd</u>, 247 Ga. 551.

<u>Bernard v. Bernard</u>, 347 Ga. App. 429 (2018) – contempt/exhaust resources to get \$ No evidence of attempt to borrow money, reduce spending, or make any attempts to pay child support/alimony – no good faith attempt to exhaust all resources to make a diligent and bonified effort to comply with Order and can't borrow funds to comply with obligation = contempt.

It is well-settled that incarceration under civil contempt is designed to coerce behavior and must be conditioned on the defendant performing some act, such as paying past-due alimony or child support.

Changing Beneficiaries

O.C.G.A. 53-4-49. Effect of testator's divorce, annulment, or remarriage to former spouse

All provisions of a will made prior to a testator's final divorce or the annulment of the testator's marriage in which no provision is made in contemplation of such event shall take effect as if the former spouse had predeceased the testator, and the provisions of Code Section 53-4-64 shall not apply with respect to the descendants of the former spouse who are not also descendants of the testator. If the testator remarries the former spouse and the testator has not revoked or amended the will that was made prior to the divorce or annulment, the remarriage shall not result in the revocation of the will and the provisions of the will that were revoked solely due to the application of this Code section shall be revived.

Sveen v. Melin, 138 S.Ct. 1815 (2018), which involved an ex-wife's claim under Minnesota law to the death benefits under her ex-husband's life insurance policy.

Although Minnesota has a <u>revocation on divorce law that provides that "the dissolution or annulment of a marriage revokes any revocable beneficiary designation made by an individual to the individual's former spouse," Minn. Stat.. 524.2804 subd. 1 (2016), the ex-wife in Sveen argued that the Minnesota law violated the Contracts Clause of the U.S. Constitution because the life insurance policy was purchased before the law was enacted. The Contracts Clause bars states from passing laws "impairing the obligation of contracts." The lower court ruled in favor of the children but the Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit reversed and found in favor of the ex-spouse.</u>

On appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court, the question presented was whether Minnesota's revocation law could apply to a beneficiary designation that pre-existed the enactment of the statute, without violating the Contracts Clause of the Constitution. The Court reasoned that the law is designed to reflect a policyholder's intent and it supplies a default rule that a policyholder can override. Specifically, the Court stated: "[t]he intent of most individuals after a divorce would be to disinherit their ex-spouse." As such, "the insured's failure to change the beneficiary after a divorce is more likely the result of neglect than choice." The Court went on to explain that "the law is unlikely to disturb any policyholder's expectations at the time the contract was signed" because it is unlikely that people are contemplating divorce when they purchase a life insurance policy. Interestingly, the Court pointed out that "the statute merely provides a default rule. It only applies if a policyholder does not update the beneficiary form. If the policyholder did update the form, nothing in the law would stop him from going ahead and renaming an ex-spouse after a divorce." (Emphasis added).

Although the <u>majority</u> ruled that <u>the beneficiary to the ex-spouse was revoked upon divorce by operation of the statute</u>, Justice Gorsuch, dissenting opinion: "... the law before us cannot survive an encounter with even the breeziest of Contracts Clause tests. It substantially impairs life insurance contracts by retroactively revising their key term."

For GA see <u>Hinkle v. Woolever</u>, 249 Ga. App. 249 (2001) – Wife filed for Divorce, Husband sought to remove Wife as beneficiary form life insurance policy, insurance company required a Final Order and Decree to include property settlement to verify ownership. Final hearing held, Order pronounced, husband dies, Final Order *issued nunc pro tunc* to date of final Order date – life insurance policy did not go to Wife because husband tried to change it/would have changed it but for the holdup on the actual Order.

Probate assets are those that pass to persons identified in a will; whereas, non-probate assets pass outside an estate's administration, typically by beneficiary designations/survivorship elections.
